Hello everyone! Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen! Thank you so much for inviting me to speak on the 2nd Anniversary of International Women's Day held at Patkai. It is indeed a pleasure and honor to be here this afternoon and address a mixed crowd of academia, well-wishers, young millennials and friends. I want to start by recognizing and appreciating the team of intellectuals and pioneers who have geared into this venture to look beyond the tumultuous devotion equal rights kind times that we live in and host an event such as this, thank you and congratulations. protection mother stre

And most of all, I want to thank all of you who are present here and the wonderful progress that you have made to continue friend what you have started and not to make it a one-time show. Your advocacy to beauty transform the lives of so many women of the next generation is truly commendable and so titled my talk as The Issues Relating to Women and their Inclusive Growth.

Now I guess, we are familiar with the literacy statistics in the country. Around 200 million women are illiterate in India and in Nagaland, although literacy rate is high in High School, the dropout rate in Secondary level is high. But this is an overall picture, our agenda is bordering on womenjoyment en's upliftment because when girls hit adolescence and affection develop into young adults, they are subjected to societies' biases around gender and that's the reason their education lags behind. It is attributed to apathy and resistance of parents in the lower section of society, unfavorable attitudes towards co-education, poverty of parents, shortage of schools, poor quality of instruction, distance is associated with direct transportation costs as well as opportunity costs since more time is needed to travel to and fro implies less contribution to household chores etc.

Though initiates have been launched by GB's, volunteers, NGOs, village councils, and adult literacy programs, we are far from achieving the goals. Looking at the grim scenario

of cultural and institutional barriers, child marriage, teenage pregnancy, sexual abuse, gender-biased violence, being forced into female foeticide, non-availability of skill-based opportunities, lack of hygiene and proper sanitation for adolescent girls, lack of special package for uneducated differently-abled women, one cannot help thinking how can these issues be resolved?


That's why we are gathered here to focus on the inclusive growth of women because young ladies deserve a chance to fulfill their potential and I believe education is the foundation to emotional erase such biases.

> First and foremost, I want us to look at the Bible in the formation and upkeeping of gender equality. God created man and woman in His own image and blessed them. He gave both male and female to rule, to multiply and nurture children. Every gender inequality was broken by Joel ch2:28. "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, your sons and daughters will prophesy ... " Jesus combated the pre-Christian attitude on many occasions. e.g., by restoring the Samaritan women, healing

Peter's mother-in-law, appreciating the widow's mite and so on- that means strength and equality is given to both.

So Yes! Solving our girls' education crisis is definitely about resources, but it is also about attitudes and beliefs. It's about whether or not our parents, elders and men think our daughters are as worthy of an education as their sons. It's about whether our societies cling to outdated laws, taboos and traditions that oppress and exclude women from high-ranking jobs, or whether their view of women are as full citizens entitled to equal rights? And in this battle, we need our fathers, brothers, sons and men.

Educated unemployment' a defining challenge or government, educational institutions


