1. Patkai Outreach Programme (POP)

1. Objective:

The Patkai Outreach Programme (POP) is a structured initiative that aims to unify the various student associations, clubs, and cells of the college under a single framework to promote community engagement, extension activities, and social responsibility. The programme encourages students to actively participate in service-oriented initiatives, fostering a sense of civic duty, leadership, and holistic development.

2. The Context:

Recognizing the need for a cohesive and organized approach to community service and extracurricular engagement, the college established the Patkai Outreach Programme (POP) as an umbrella initiative.

3. The Practice:

Under POP, the following mechanisms have been institutionalized:

1. Activity Calendar & Reporting:

Each association, club, and cell prepares an **annual activity calendar** outlining their planned initiatives, events, and outreach programs. Reports on all activities conducted are submitted to the **IQAC** for documentation and assessment.

2. Record-Keeping & Documentation:

Every association, club, and cell maintains a **register and logbook** to systematically record details of their activities, participation, and outcomes. Proper documentation is maintained to ensure **transparency**, accountability, and alignment with institutional objectives.

3. Observance of Important Days & Events:

All student-led groups are encouraged to celebrate and commemorate significant local, national, and international days, festivals, and awareness programs. This initiative enhances cultural engagement, social responsibility, and awareness among students.

4. Collaborative and Community-Oriented Approach:

The programme integrates the efforts of various associations and clubs such as: Art Club, Career Guidance Cell, Drama Club, Green Club/Eco Club, Legal Services Clinic, National Cadet Corps (NCC), National Service Scheme (NSS), Patkai Reading and Writing Club, Red Ribbon Club, Women Cell / Gender Champions, Young Indians (Yi), Youth Red Cross Club
