Curriculum Development

Patkai Christian College has been committed to fostering a dynamic academic environment that aligns with national educational frameworks and global best practices. In 2016, the institution implemented the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) at the undergraduate level, in accordance with the University Grants Commission (UGC) mandate. This system allows students greater flexibility in choosing courses while ensuring a well-rounded education. To maintain academic rigor and relevance, the syllabi for all programs undergo systematic reviews and updates every three years.

Further, in response to the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college is set to introduce a restructured curriculum from the 2024-2025 academic session. This transition entails a comprehensive revision of syllabi, ensuring that the curriculum remains contemporary, multidisciplinary, and aligned with emerging educational and professional demands.

Teaching and Learning

To uphold academic excellence, each department prepares a department-specific academic calendar every semester. This is done under the supervision of the Academic Dean, ensuring that teaching schedules, assessments, and co-curricular engagements are planned systematically. Faculty members are encouraged to incorporate innovative pedagogical approaches, including experiential learning, blended teaching methods, and digital tools to enhance student engagement and comprehension.

Examination and Evaluation

The college follows a structured evaluation framework comprising two key components: Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End-Semester Examinations (ESE). CIA encompasses regular assignments, class tests, presentations, and other formative assessments, ensuring that students engage with their coursework consistently. The ESE serves as a summative evaluation of students' learning at the end of each semester. Additionally, co-curricular activities form an integral part of the assessment system, with mandatory student participation fostering holistic development beyond academics.

Research and Development

The college actively promotes a culture of research and academic inquiry. The Research Committee plays a pivotal role in fostering scholarly engagement through research initiatives, symposiums, and consultancy services. Faculty members and students are encouraged to contribute to academic literature through publications and collaborative research projects. Recognizing the importance of intellectual property, the college established an Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell in 2018, which provides guidance on patenting, copyrights, and other related matters.
