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Report of Awareness Programme on Electronic Waste Organized by Eco Club, Patkai Christian College (Autonomous)

On the occasion of Earth Day, 22nd April 2025, the Eco Club organized an awareness programme focused on Electronic Waste management. She also highlighted that students and institutions can contribute to e-waste management through collection and disposing off to a common collection point which would be collected and later on sent for recycling plants.
