

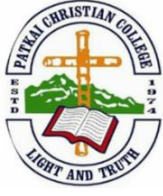

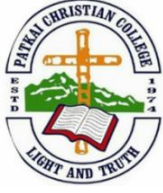

Report on the 3rd Patkai Trophy 2025

The 3rd Patkai Trophy 2025, organised by Patkai Christian College (Autonomous), was successfully conducted from 29th to 31st October 25 at the college ground under the theme “Celebrating Talents.” The three-day inter-institutional sports championship brought together students from various colleges and institutes to promote sportsmanship, teamwork, and healthy competition.

A total of 24 educational institutions, including 23 from Nagaland and one from Assam, participated in the tournament. The championship featured competitions in volleyball, basketball, and badminton for both men and women, and football for men.

Delivering the welcome address during the opening ceremony, the Principal of Patkai Christian College, Dr. Thepfuvilie Pieru, expressed gratitude to God and highlighted the role of sports in fostering physical fitness, discipline, and unity among students. The event was graced by Tongpang Ozukum, MLA and Advisor to the Department of Water Resources, Government of Nagaland, who attended as the inaugural guest. In his address, he commended the college for giving equal importance to academics and extracurricular activities and encouraged young people to pursue their passion in sports and other creative fields, especially in the context of increasing competition for government employment.

Advisor Ozukum officially declared the championship open with a ceremonial kick-off, marking the beginning of the sporting events. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Wetsete Thopi, Assistant Professor and Dean of Students.


Following the inauguration, preliminary matches in volleyball, basketball, badminton, and football were held throughout the day, marking an energetic start to the three-day championship. The Patkai Trophy continues to serve as an important platform for inter-institutional interaction and the celebration of sporting talent among youth.
